LESSON 8



Jesus is alive today.



Bible Verse: “Why are you looking among the dead for someone who is alive? He isn’t here! He is risen from the dead!” (Luke 24:5b-6a).



Idea!

Celebrate Jesus’ resurrection—the best surprise ever—with special, surprise Easter eggs. To make these confetti-filled eggs, you’ll need several raw eggs, a spoon, materials to color the eggs, colored construction paper, a hole punch, a funnel, glue, and tissue or crepe paper.

Use the end of the spoon to break a dime-sized hole in the top of a raw egg. Remove the eggshell from the hole and pour out the egg. Rinse out the eggshell and let it dry.

Color the eggshell using Easter egg dye or food coloring. Then make confetti by punching holes in colored construction paper. Use a funnel to help you pour the confetti into the colored eggshell. Cover the hole in the egg by gluing tissue or crepe paper over it.

Slip your surprise eggs into a family member’s Easter basket.

Faith Walk

A popular Easter greeting begins with one person saying, “He is risen,” and others responding, “He is risen indeed!” Have family members take turns initiating this greeting each day this week. Welcome others to breakfast, begin meals, or end phone conversations with this reminder that Jesus is alive.
